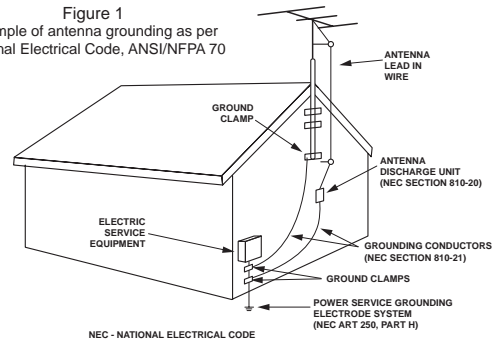
# SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Read Instructions** - All the safety and operating instructions should be read before the product is operated.

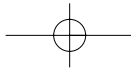

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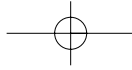
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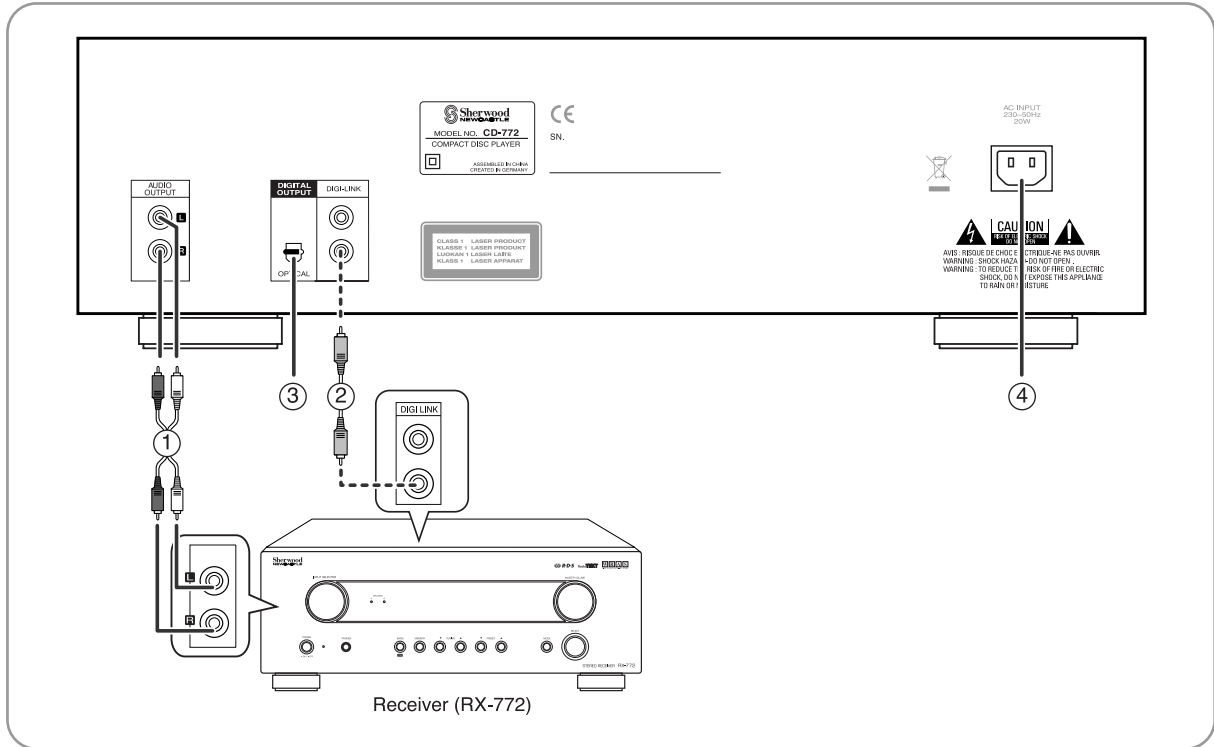
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## Rear Panel Connections

- Do not plug the AC input cord into the wall AC outlet until all connections are completed.
- Be sure to connect the white plugs to the L(Left) and the red plugs to the R(Right) jacks when making connections with the supplied cords.
- Refer to the connecting diagram in the operating instructions of your amplifier/receiver.



### 1. Connecting AUDIO OUTPUT jacks

Connect these jacks to CD (or AUX) INPUT jacks of your amplifier/receiver.

### 2. Connecting DIGI-LINK jack

Connect this jack to the DIGI-LINK jack of Sherwood system amplifier/receiver such as an RX-772, etc. to control this unit remotely by DIGI-LINK system. (For details, refer to the operating instructions of Sherwood amplifier/receiver.)

#### Note :

- The DIGI-LINK operation may not work on some Sherwood components.

### 3. Connecting OPTICAL DIGITAL OUTPUT jack

Connect this jack to the OPTICAL DIGITAL INPUT jack of your amplifier/receiver to enjoy live digital sound.

#### Notes :

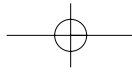
- It is not recommended to record digital audio signals with digital audio connection between this unit and MD and CD recorder, etc.  
When recording the sounds played on this unit, record them through the AUDIO OUTPUT jacks.
- All of the commercially-available optical fiber cords cannot be used for audio components.  
If there is an optical fiber cord which cannot be connected to your components, consult your dealer or nearest service organization.

### 4. AC INPUT

Plug the supplied AC input cord into this AC input and then into the wall AC outlet.

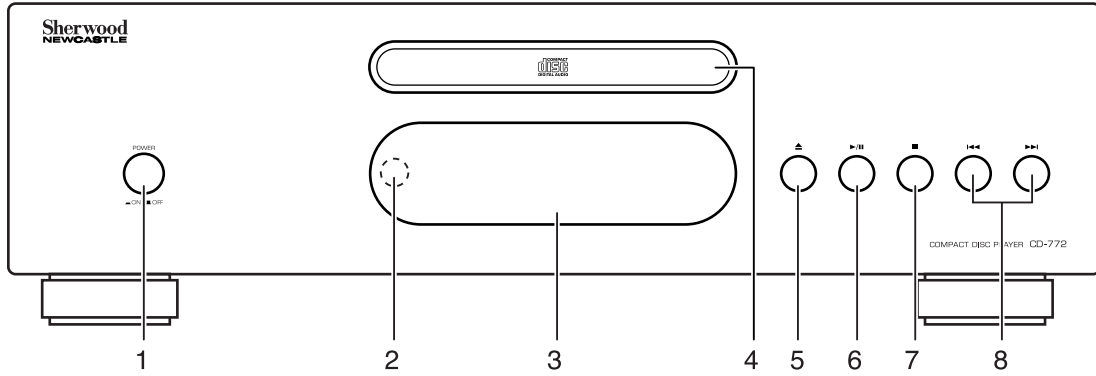

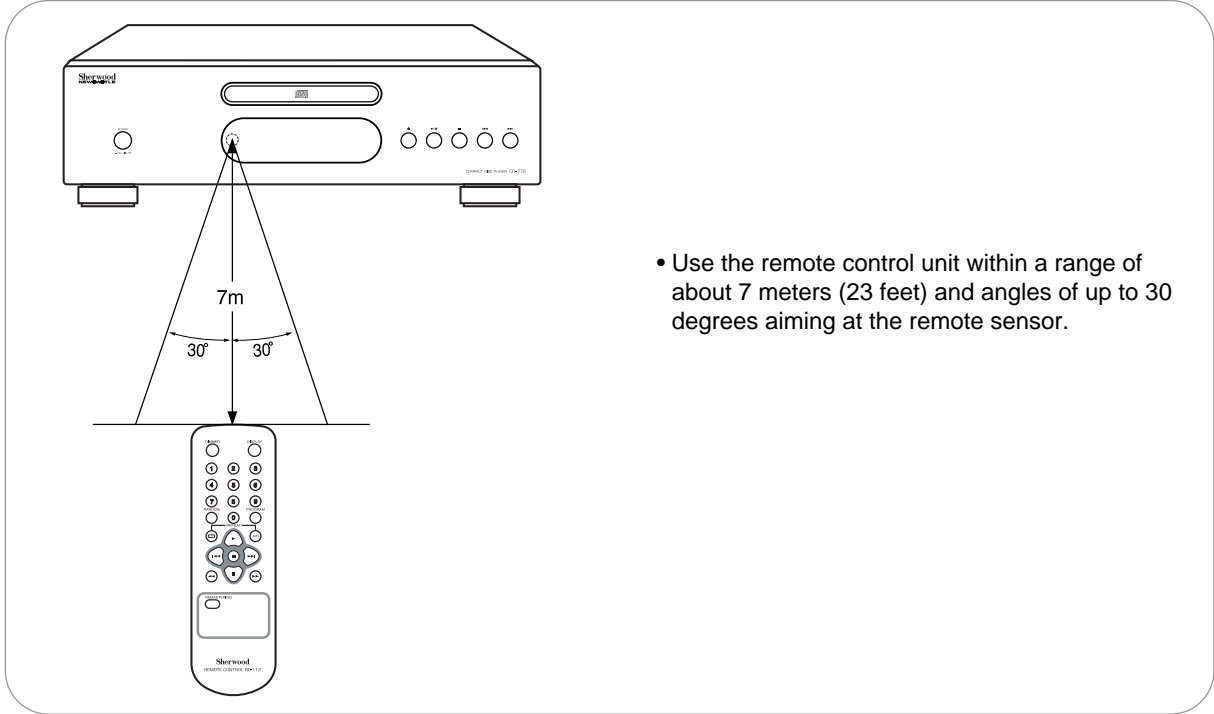
## Remote Controls





1. **POWER SWITCH**  
Push this switch to turn the power on and to enter the operating mode.  
To switch the power off, push again this switch.
2. **REMOTE SENSOR**
3. **FLUORESCENT DISPLAY**
4. **DISC TRAY**  
Load a disc on the disc tray.
5. **OPEN/CLOSE (▲) BUTTON**  
Press this button to open or to close the disc tray.
6. **PLAY/PAUSE (▶/⏸) BUTTON**
  - a. Press this button to start play in the stop or pause mode.
  - b. Press this button to interrupt play temporarily and press again to resume play.
7. **STOP (■) BUTTON**  
Press this button to stop play.
8. **REVERSE/FROWARD SKIP (◀◀ / ▶▶) BUTTONS**  
Press the button to skip to the previous track or the next track.
9. **REVERSE/FROWARD SEARCH (◀◀ / ▶▶) BUTTONS**  
Press and hold down the button to search for a specific passage in fast reverse or in fast forward.
10. **DIMMER BUTTON**  
Press this button to select the brightness of the fluorescent display as desired.
11. **DISPLAY BUTTON**  
Press this button to display the different time information on the audio CD or the different name information, etc. on the MP3 disc.
12. **NUMERIC (0~9) BUTTONS**  
Press the corresponding buttons to select a track for play or programming.
13. **RANDOM PLAY BUTTON**  
Press this button to play tracks in random order.
14. **PROGRAM BUTTON**  
Press this button to program your favorite tracks.
15. **REPEAT (↺↻) BUTTON**  
Press this button to play a track, a folder or a disc repeatedly.
16. **REPEAT A/B BUTTON**  
Press this button to play a specific passage repeatedly.
17. **REMASTERING BUTTON**  
Press this button to process the audio signal readed from the disc and to converts its sampling frequency to 192 kHz for a more detailed sound quality.

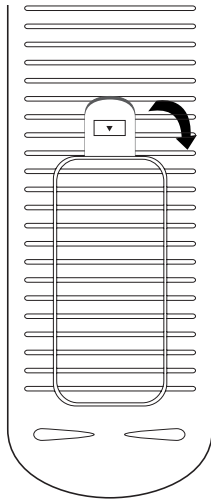

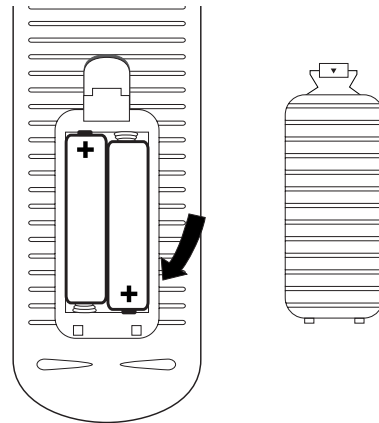
- Use the remote control unit within a range of about 7 meters (23 feet) and angles of up to 30 degrees aiming at the remote sensor.

## LOADING BATTERIES

1. Remove the cover.



2. Load two batteries ("AAA" size, 1.5 V) matching the polarity.






- Remove the batteries when they are not used for a long time.
- Do not use the rechargeable batteries (Ni-Cd type).

This unit supports the following discs.

- This unit supports CD-R and CD-RW discs recorded in audio CD (CD-DA) format or MP3 format.

#### Unplayable discs

- Since this unit cannot support disc types, formats and file types not listed above, do not play such discs.
- Some CD-R and CD-RW discs cannot be played due to incomplete disc finalization, recording quality or physical condition of the disc, characteristics of recording device or authoring software, etc.  
See the operating instructions supplied with your recording device for more information.
- Some audio CDs use copy protection that doesn't conform to the official CD standard. Since these are non-standard discs, this unit cannot play them properly.
- This unit cannot play DTS CD.

#### Discs made on personal computers

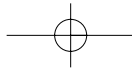
- Discs made on personal computers, including those of a compatible format, may not work properly in this unit because of incorrect settings in the disc burning software. Check the operating instructions supplied with your disc burning software for additional compatibility information.

### MP3 COMPATIBILITY

- MP3 discs must be ISO 9660 Level 1 or Level 2, Joliet compliant. Supported formats : Mode 1, Mode 2.
- Folders can be up to eight levels deep.
- MP3 files must be MPEG-1/MPG-2 Audio Layer 3 format with a sampling rate of between 16 kHz and 48 kHz and a bit-rate of between 32 kbps and 320 kbps (128 kbps or 192 kbps recommended). Incompatible files cannot be played.
- Fixed bit-rate MP3 files are recommended, however, variable bit-rate (VBR) MP3 files between 8 kbps and 320 kbps are supported (Playing times may display incorrectly).
- MP3 files must have a ".mp3" or ".MP3" file name extension. MP3 files without the proper extension will not be recognized. To prevent noise and malfunction, do not use these extensions for other types of files.
- This unit supports up to 500 MP3 files and up to 200 folders per disc. (In this case, Disc and File names contain 30 characters and Folder names contain 20 characters.) Files and folders in excess of this cannot be played. Note that if the file and folder structure is very complicated, this unit may not be able to read or play all of the MP3 files on the disc. If the disc, folder or file names contain many characters, this unit may not support 500 MP3 files.
- Disc names may contain up to 30 characters. File and folder names may contain up to 60 characters.
- Characters except "A-Z", "a-z", "0-9", "-", etc. cannot be played.
- Multisession discs are supported, however, some multisession discs may take a long time to load and some may not load at all. When burning CDs we recommend that you use a single session (disc-at-once), and select "Disc Close".
- The ID3 tag version 1.0 is supported.

#### Note :

- With CD-R and CD-RW discs that contain many files and folders, and files other than MP3s, it may take a long time to read the disc. We recommend that you include only MP3 files on your disc, use about 20 folders, and limit folder nesting to three levels deep.



## CARE AND HANDLING OF DISCS

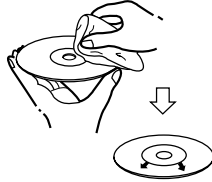
- In handling a disc, hold it carefully with edges.



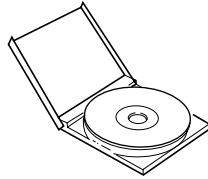
- Do not stick paper or write anything on the printed surface.



- Fingermarks and dust on the recorded surface should be carefully wiped off with a soft cloth. Wipe straight from the inside to the outside of the disc.



- Always keep the discs in their cases after use to protect them from dust and scratches.

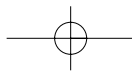
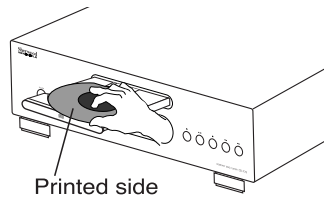


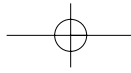
- Do not use a cracked, deformed, or repaired disc. These discs are easily broken and may cause serious personal injury and apparatus malfunction.



### Notes:

- Do not expose discs to direct sunlight, high humidity or high temperature for a long time.
- When loading or unloading a disc in the disc tray, always place it with the printed side up.



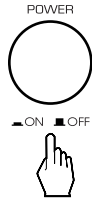

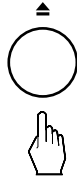
## PLAYING CDS

### 1. Turn the power on.



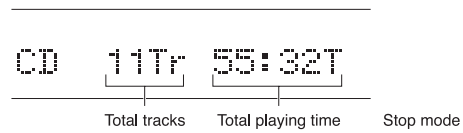
- The power is turned on and this unit enters the operating mode.
- To switch the power off, push the POWER switch again.

### 2. Open the disc tray to load a disc with the printed side up, then close it.

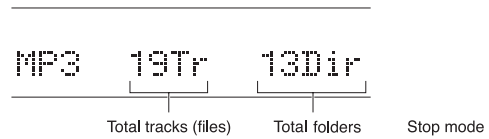


- 8 cm (3 inch) discs can be loaded on the inside circle of the tray, too.
- It may take a long time to read a disc that contains many files and folders, etc.

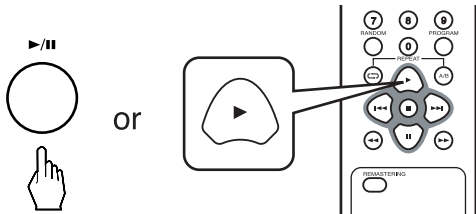

When loading a MP3 disc

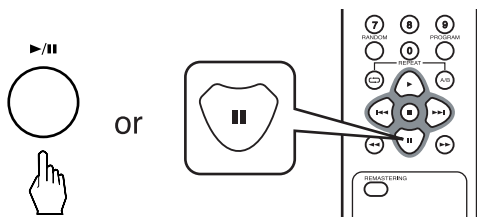


### 3. Start play.



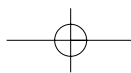
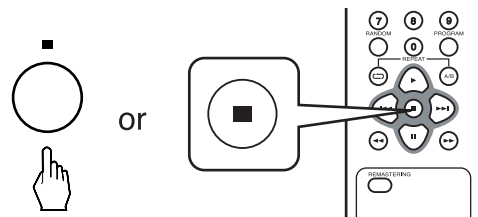
- "▶" indicator is displayed and play starts.

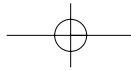
### 4. To interrupt play temporarily.



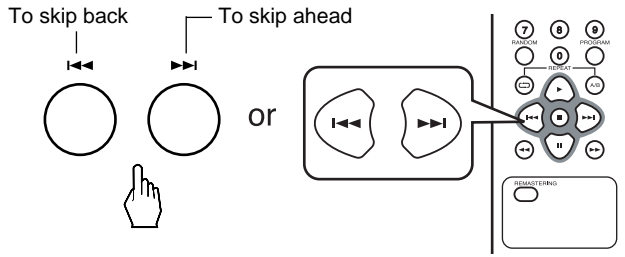
- "||" indicator is displayed and play is paused.
- To resume play, press this button again.

### 5. To stop play.





### To select tracks during play



- Each time the button is pressed, a track is skipped.
- When the REVERSE SKIP ( ◀◀ ) button is pressed once midway through a track, play returns to the beginning of that track. When it is pressed again, a track is skipped.

- You can select a track with pressing the NUMERIC buttons on the remote control.

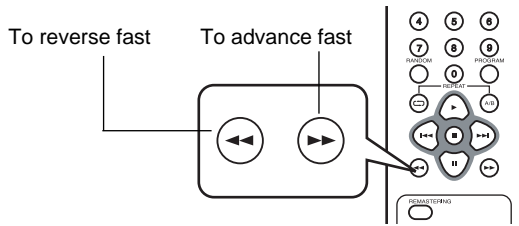
Example : For "3" : ③  
 For "15" : ① → within 2 sec. → ⑤  
 For "127" : ① → within 2 sec. → ② → within 2 sec. → ⑦

#### Notes :

- During random play or program play, you cannot select a track with pressing the NUMERIC buttons.
- During random play, you cannot move the track that is currently playing to other tracks with pressing the REVERSE SKIP ( ◀◀ ) button.

### To fast forward or fast reverse during play

- Press and hold down the button until the desired passage is reached.



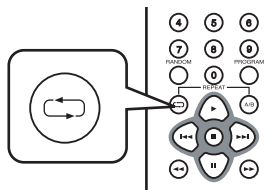
- For MP3 discs, fast reverse only works within the MP3 track that is currently playing.

## REPEAT PLAY

- You can play a track, a folder (for MP3 disc only), a disc, or a specific passage repeatedly.

### Repeating a track, a folder, a disc

During play of the desired track or folder, press the REPEAT ( ↺ ) button.



- Then the selected repeat mode is displayed.

- Each time this button is pressed, the repeat mode changes depending on the disc types as follows :

- In case of Audio CD

A - RPT : Entire disc repeat

1 - RPT : Track repeat

Off : Repeat mode off

- In case of MP3 disc

A - RPT : Entire disc repeat

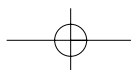
F - RPT : Folder repeat

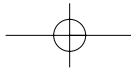

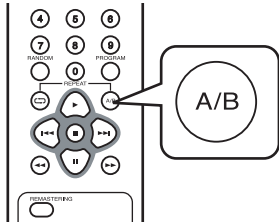
- During program play of MP3 disc, you cannot select "F - RPT" (folder repeat).
- During random play of MP3 disc, you cannot select any repeat mode.





### Repeating a specific passage

1. During play at the beginning of the desired passage, press the REPEAT A/B button.



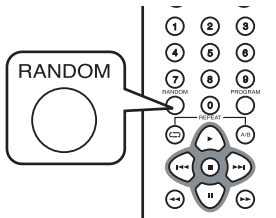
- Then "A" is displayed.

2. At the end of the desired passage, press the REPEAT A/B button again.

- Then "AB" is displayed and the passage between points A and B is played repeatedly.
  - To cancel the repeat A/B play, press the REPEAT A/B button again.

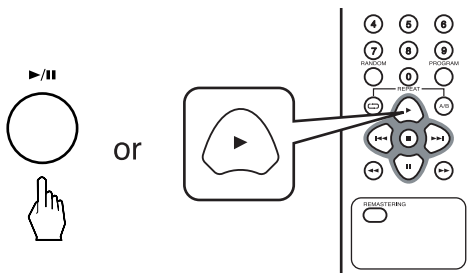

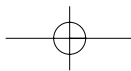


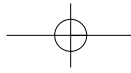

- To cancel the random play, press the STOP ( ) button to enter the stop mode and press the RANDOM PLAY button. Then, "RDM" disappears.

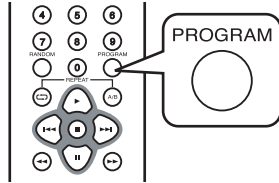

**Checking the programmed tracks**

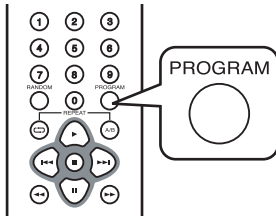
- In the program mode (meaning "PGM" is displayed in the stop mode), press the FORWARD/REVERSE SEARCH( << / >> ) buttons.



- Each time these buttons are pressed, the programmed tracks are displayed in the programmed order or in the opposite order.

**Clearing the programmed tracks**

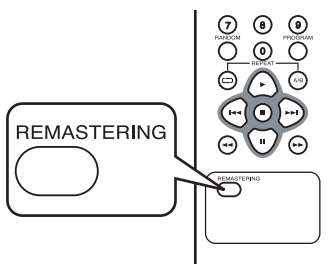
- In the program mode (meaning "PGM" is displayed in the stop mode), press the PROGRAM button.



- Then "PGM" disappears and the programmed tracks are all cleared.
- Opening the disc tray clears all programmed tracks.

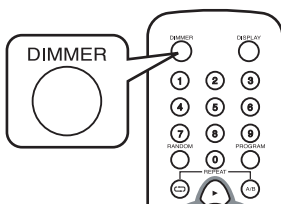
**LISTENING TO MUSIC FOR A MORE DETAILED SOUND QUALITY**

- The remastering processes the audio signal readed from the disc and converts its sampling frequency to 192 kHz for a more detailed sound quality.
- Press the REMASTERING button.

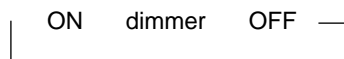

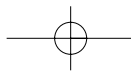
**ADJUSTING THE BRIGHTNESS OF THE FLUORESCENT DISPLAY**

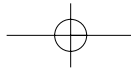


- Each time the DIMMER button is pressed, the brightness of the fluorescent display changes as follows :

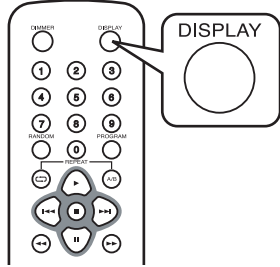


- In the display OFF mode, pressing any button will cancel the display OFF mode for several seconds to display the operation status.



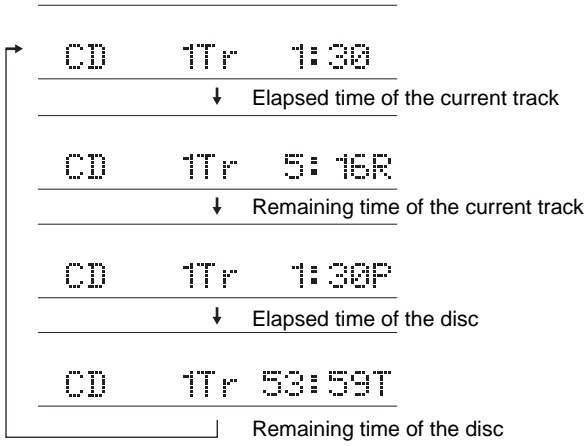


**DISPLAYING DISC INFORMATION DURING PLAY**

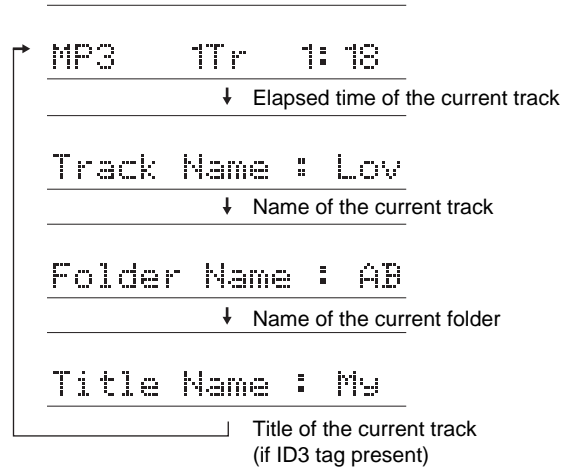

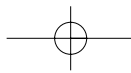


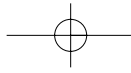

- When the elapsed time or the remaining time of the disc is more than 99 min. 59 sec., "-- : --" will be displayed.



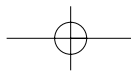


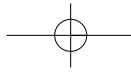
